- Health and Dental Care
- Lab Tests
- Basic Radiology

- Physical Therapy
- On-site Pharmacy dispenses **FREE MEDICATION**
- If we do not have the patient's medication we then provide Prescription Assistance by working directly with the manufactures to obtain **FREE MEDICATION**.
- Assistance in obtaining Medicare and Medicaid and help transitioning to a preferred provider.
- Group and private Diabetic educational sessions
- We also provide over the counter items: medication, socks, and hygiene products
